Wireless Mystery Theatre Presents: Irish Gothic

What country has given greater horror to the world than Ireland, where Dracula and Carmilla were first dreamed up?

An evening of Irish Horror is the perfect, cozy scare for when the air gets cold and the night grows dark, with two classic Irish spook stories reanimated in the dark, with live music - two original scores for violin, cello, and guitar.

In Dracula's Guest, the expunged prologue from Bram Stoker's masterpiece, Jonathan Harker finds himself under the watchful

eye of an unknown force, while in an unknown country. This early example of folk-horror uses the strange and estranging customs of an isolated German village to ratchet up the scares, revealing more of the dark powers and reach of the titular antihero.

While in J.S. Le Fanu's classic, Green Tea, a village curate is driven to the brink of madness by terrible visions, but is there something unusual in his mind or in his drink. Le Fanu, the Invisible Prince of Victorian Dublin, invented psychological horror, treading the line between the supernatural and the insane, through implication, suggestion, and blurred outlines that could as easily be ghosts as hallucinations.


A free park and ride shuttle bus service will be in operation from Caterpillar, Old Glenarm Road and Ballygally.



Richard Hayward's East Antrim

In association with Paul Clements, travel writer, broadcaster and former BBC journalist, this exhibition looks at the life of Richard Hayward (1892-1964). Hayward, a popular actor, singer, writer and broadcaster, was born in Southport but was raised in Larne where he lived at Chelmsford Place.

As a pioneering filmmaker, he appeared in the film The Luck of the Irish, filmed in Glynn in 1935. In his travel books, he opened up an unknown Ireland to thousands of people. Part of the fabric of life for many people and known all over Ireland, few writers are more closely associated with Larne and East Antrim than Richard Hayward. The museum will be open on Saturday 16th November and Saturday 14th December for this exhibition.

Why not spend Halloween with Larne Drama Circle listening to a reading of Terry Pratchett's 'Wyrd Sisters'!

Terry Pratchett takes Shakespeare's Macbeth and then turns it up 'till the knob comes off. It is all there – a wicked duke and duchess, the ghost of the murdered king, dim soldiers, strolling players, and a land in peril. Who stands between the Kingdom and destruction? Three witches. Granny Weatherwax (intolerant, self-opinionated, powerful), Nanny Ogg (down-to-earth, vulgar) and Magrat Garlick (naïve, fond of occult jewellery and bunnies).

Terry Pratchett's 'Wyrd Sisters' was adapted for the stage by Stephen Briggs. Stephen Briggs has been involved in amateur dramatics for over 25 years and he assures us that the play can be staged without needing the budget of Industrial Light and Magic. 

Richard Hayward (1892-1964) was raised and educated in Larne, a place that always held a special affection in his heart. Hayward became one of Ireland's leading cultural figures and in a busy career; he was a writer, singer, actor and film star, as well as a broadcaster, tour guide and folklorist. In his poetry and travel books, his films

and singing, he celebrated the East Antrim coast and was inspired by the landscape, its people and its history. In this talk, Paul Clements will focus on the significance of the area on Richard Hayward's work and how he helped to promote tourism in Co. Antrim in the middle decades of the 20 century.
